

## Chapter Three Translation Problems: Set 6

**Translate** each of the following English sentences into the formal language.

1. Though I'd like to make it to the mahjongg game , I can't take the time off work.  
(**P**: I'd like to make it to the mahjongg game. **Q**: I can take the time off work.)

2. Even though Jack is incapable of flight, both birds and squirrels fear him.  
(**P**: Jack is capable of flight. **Q**: Birds fear Jack. **R**: Squirrels fear Jack)

3a. It is not the case that even though Ace graduated from Yale, he is wise.

3b. Even though it is not the case that Ace graduated from Yale, he is wise.  
(**P**: Ace graduated from Yale. **Q**: Ace is wise.)

4. Unless Rex helps us move the furniture, we'll either have to hire movers or finish the job tomorrow.

(**P**: Rex helps us move the furniture. **Q**: We'll have to hire movers. **R**: We'll have to finish the job tomorrow)

5. Unless Cindy is a cheerleader who has low standards, Rex is a student who won't have a date to the prom.

(**P**: Cindy is a cheerleader. **Q**: Cindy has low standards. **R**: Rex is a student. **S**: Rex will have a date to the prom)

6. Though Rex is neither strong nor a skilled fighter, he won't back down unless Ace apologizes.

(**P**: Rex is strong. **Q**: Rex is a skilled fighter. **R**: Rex will back down. **S**: Ace apologizes)

7. Unless it is both sunny and warm, we will neither have a picnic nor play volleyball.

(**P**: It is sunny. **Q**: It is warm. **R**: We will have a picnic. **S**: We will play volleyball)
