

## Typing Out Formal Symbols in WebCT

Since an ordinary computer keyboard already has a tilde (“~,” next to the “1” key), tildes are no problem for WebCT assignments.

For a wedge (“^”), we will use a slash and backslash (located under the “?” mark, and by the “Enter” key): /\

For a vel (“v”) we will use the same symbols, but in the opposite order: \/

Here are some examples:

$(\sim P \vee Q)$ : ( ~P \/ Q )

$(P \wedge \sim Q)$ : ( P /\ ~Q )
