Session Description

Vocalist Tom Birkner and pianist Paul Johnston will perform music from the American songbook and discuss its importance and interpretation. Inspired by the collaborations of Tony Bennett and Bill Evans, the program will include music by celebrated composers and lyricists including Harold Arlen, Irving Berlin, George and Ira Gershwin, Henry Mancini, Johnny Mercer, and Cole Porter. Vocalists and instrumentalists alike can learn a great deal about phrasing and interpretation by listening to great vocalists like Ella Fitzgerald, Sarah Vaughan, Tony Bennett, and Frank Sinatra, among others. Hearing and playing this music can also help improvisers develop a melodic sensibility and become familiar with standard harmonic progressions. The program will also include performance of and discussion about newer music from artists including Stephen Sondheim, Joni Mitchell, and Paul McCartney.

Thomas Birkner serves as Director of Instrumental Music at Belleville West High School and teaches improvisation at Southwestern Illinois College. He taught previously at the University of Illinois, Parkland College, and Terre Haute South High School, and has served on the faculty of the Summer Jazz Camp at Eastern Illinois University for over 30 years. A graduate of Eastern Illinois University and the University of Illinois, Dr. Birkner has been recognized as an outstanding soloist by the International Trumpet Guild and the National Association of Teachers of Singing. He has maintained an active career as a founding member of the American Music Trio and the New Golden Rule Orchestra, a jazz repertory ensemble. His research has been published by the International Association of Jazz Educators, and he has recorded on Einstein Records, Opus One, and the Sea Breeze Jazz recording labels. He has performed at the Chicago Jazz Festival and Chicago's Orchestra Hall, as well as major jazz festivals in Italy, Sweden, and Denmark. He resides in Belleville, Illinois, with his wife Kathryn and children, John, Ryan, and Erin.

Paul Johnston, piano, is active as a teacher, performer, and composer. He is on the faculty at Eastern Illinois University, where he directs a jazz band, coaches combos, and teaches jazz piano, improvisation, and arranging. He is at home in a wide variety of musical styles and has performed with artists including Clark Terry, Benny Golson, Nancy Wilson, Monica Mancini, and Bernadette Peters. A native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, he studied at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and at Indiana University, where he completed a Master's Degree in jazz studies and a Performer Diploma in piano. Soloists, chamber groups, and jazz ensembles from across the country have performed his compositions and arrangements, and Alfred Music has published several of collections of his solo jazz piano arrangements. Paul taught for eight summers at the Interlochen Center for the Arts and is an alumnus of Ravinia's Steans Music Institute and the Henry Mancini Institute.
